Ancient	A time in the very distant past and no longer in existence.
Archeologist	An archaeologist is somebody who looks at ancient sites and objects to learn about the past by looking for clues/evidence.
Afterlife	The place where Egyptians believed they would go after they died.
Akhet	The season of the year when the Nile river flooded. A very important time of year in the desert!
BC / AD	Before Christ / Anno Domini.
Canopic jars	Special jars that held the organs of a mummy including the lungs, intestines, liver and stomach.
Egypt	Egypt is a country in Northern Africa and it borders the Mediterranean Sea and the Red Sea.
Egyptologist	An archaeologist who focuses Ancient Egypt. Howard Carter was an Egyptologist.
Hieroglyphics	A type of writing that used a combination of pictures and symbols.
Mummification	The process of preserving a body after death in preparation for the afterlife.
Papyrus	A plant that grew on the banks of the Nile. It was used as an early version of paper.
Peret	The growing season after Akhet.
Pharaoh	The supreme ruler of all of Ancient Egypt.
Pyramid	Ancient pyramid-shaped structures that were built as tombs for the country's pharaohs.
River Nile	Found in northeast Africa, the Nile has long been recognised as the longest river in the world.
Sarcophagus	A large stone box that held a mummy's coffin. Often richly decorated for Pharaohs.
Settler	A person who moves with a group of others to live in a new country or area.
Shaduf	A device used in Egypt and other Eastern countries for raising water.
Shemu	The harvesting season when crops were cut.




DID YOU KNOW...?
